Eve Mokotoff, MPH, is widely recognized as a national expert on collecting HIV surveillance data and its use for prevention and care. She has been an outspoken member of the HIV surveillance community speaking up for their needs at national meetings, consultations and calls for three decades. As such, between 1999 and 2012, she was an invited expert at over a dozen CDC consultations and authored or co-authored eleven Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) Position Statements on HIV surveillance, use of data and policy. Her work over the past 30 years has given her the opportunity to understand HIV surveillance from a national perspective and participate in setting policy.

Located at the Detroit Health Department, she started and led a successful HIV Surveillance Program for the State of Michigan for over 26 years. In 2012 she started the consulting firm HIV Counts. In this role, she has worked with CDC, CSTE, NASTAD, JSI, Inc., HealthHIV, GEARS, Inc. and Emory University providing technical assistance (TA) to 20 state and local health departments on the implementation of “Data to Care”—using HIV surveillance and other data directly for prevention and care.

Her work in Detroit led to close working relationships with the community and its response to the epidemic. For example, in 2013 she served as Epidemiology Consultant for The Stigma Index, a project of the Global Network of People Living with HIV/AIDS in North America (GNP+NA), summarizing the HIV epidemic in the 21 states and cities being considered for conducting the Stigma Index Survey.

Between 2015 and 2017 she was the Project Director for the GEARS Data to Care Technical Assistance contract with DHAP’s Capacity Building Branch supervising a team of TA Providers who worked with 13 health departments. Currently, she is a Data to Care TA Provider for NASTAD’s Data to Care Capacity Building Assistance Program and the Director of HIV Counts.
